Georgia Mountains


A few weeks ago at GS Giants March Moto Madness in Telico Plains Tn Everett and I camped beside some nice guys from Alabama. After making friends with our camping neighbors Scott Walton invited me to a KLR ride in Suches Ga

this past weekend (The Valley In the Sky Rally-KLR Community). One of my personal goals is to ride in all 50 states. I have toured all over the East but somehow have never run a tire across Ga so I decided to attend.

Thursday I loaded the DR and started North. A big storm was approaching and I was hoping to get on the road early to beat the storm. As usual, work wouldn't participate in the early departure.

I ended up just in the front line of the enormous thunderstorms that crossed the South. At times I could not see to drive. I pulled over and used the opportunity to jump out and check the bike tie downs and the heat of the trailer hubs a few times.





SUV and dropped the seats ,threw down my sleeping bag and being lazy I didn't blow up my air mattress. I had a very restless night. Friday dawned clear, and I put the tent up before the first ride. I believe we had

around 15 riders in our group as we started. I was a little concerned as I didn't know anyone's riding ability and we were headed for dirt. I thought they would break into groups, but they did not. Having ridden in smaller groups where riders pass unsafely and slow people down I was expecting a few issues. However, Scott knew how to lead a group. He announced at the first stop If someone in front of you is slowing you down move safely forward or you can leave the group. He also said he didn't want to hear any complaining back at the campfire. As we started the dirt trails, he dropped back and moved forward through the group asking people to move up or back as the riders abilities became apparent. By the second stop for a break, we had a pretty good line up which continued through



Friday and Saturday. I felt I should start at the back but was up in the front of the pack pretty quickly. We rode some great roads the first day as we covered gravel, dirt, rocky trails, and a few river crossings. I soon found the group to be fun and interactive. After a little over 100 miles, we returned to the campground.

After a shower and dinner, we moved to the campfires to talk about the day and have a few beers. The banter and conversations kept me laughing all evening. IT WAS COLD that night. I was in my best cold rated sleeping bag with a flannel liner, so I was pretty warm



and slept great. Saturday morning my bike wouldn't start. The guy who was holding his hand over my exhaust, Tom, wasn't helping the issue. I decided if they were pulling pranks on me I must be fitting in the group. The second day we put on another hundred miles followed by another great dinner and evening around the campfire. I received some bantering about telling one of the guys he was holding me up a little bit as I passed him. They also decided I was game

for abuse as I ride through every mud hole instead of trying to miss them. In answer "That's why I run 606's."

Sunday morning with a little help I loaded the DR and drove 6 hours back to Pensacola. I was not in the mood to return to the beach but blared some 80"s music which put me in a better frame of mind.

I have now ridden the Ga mountains and made a lot of new friends. I hope to return and ride more of the dirt trails. I passed out information to our rally to everyone at the camp ground. Hopefully some of them will attend.

RAMS Meeting Minutes -April 2018

The meeting was called to order by President Art Manchester on April 13, 2019 at 1:00 PM at Village Creek State Park, Wynne, AR. There were 23 RAMS and 3 bikes in attendance. The Meeting was started prior to the published time due to inclement weather and the feeling that no additional RAMS were coming.

Call to Order

- 1. We have no new members for this month.
- 2. We currently have 64 returning members for 2019.
- 3. There was 1 guest for the meeting: Joe Barber who came with Charlie Bishop (and joined after the meeting).
- 4. Thanks to Meeting Host: The Dale and Bennett Families.

New Business

- 1. We still need a few volunteers for the triathlons. If you are interested, please see Art Manchester IV.
- 2. We also need Volunteers to host Donut Saturdays. See Art if you are interested.
- 3. The Chartered Club Campsite and Tent for the 2019 MOA National has been secured and paid for.

RAMS Rally Update

- 1. The rally chairs for 2019 are Bryan Leonard and Steve Clark.
- 2. We have Chair volunteers for most of the Committees. The committees still needing Chairs are:

Trash and Sanitation - Trailer - "T" Shirt Sales - Signage

- 3. The question of the Rally Coffee pot was raised by Spencer Bennett. He commented that the current pot seems to be somewhat fragile and may be more pot than the RAMS Rally needs for our new base of 100 attendees. This led to a discussion by Steve Hamilton, who has a good deal of Coffee Chair experience, going over the issues and he agreed that the nuclear pot is more than we need and does have some maintenance issues. He also pointed out that the smaller pots would require a screening wall to allow them to retain heat and would require more monitoring for levels, but that they would work as well as what we currently have. Another benefit is that we would no longer have to have 220 volt power, so the pots could be located in a more convenient area of the tent. A motion was made by Spencer and seconded by Steve Clark, that we purchase two 40 cup pots for this year's rally and see how they work, with the possibility of selling the big pot if they work out. This motion was approved unanimously.
- 4. The question of whether or not to buy "Rally Cups" for this year was brought up by Steve Clark and the decision was made by the Rally Chair and Co-Chair that we should
