Movement to adjourn by Jonathan Gifford, seconded by Hank Joe Marshall, approved unanimously.


RAMS March 2017 Tech Session

The RAMS March Tech Session was postponed from March 11 to March 18 due to bad weather and this turned out to be a very good thing as the weather on March 18 was beautiful and allowed inside and outside work at the same time.

The Tech Session got off to a good start with Greg LieVan showing up at 8:00 sharp with his K1100 LT to do a valve check and adjust. This insured him a spot on the lift and he was soon deep in the dis-assembly process. Just as that was going well, Jonathan & Nathan Gifford arrived with an R1200 GSW to get an oil change and valve check done, followed by Jimmy Bennett with his K1100 RS for a BarBak install.

With the maintenance tasks well under way and the weather cooperating by being warm and sunny, Rick Coffman and I proceeded to try and make ourselves useful and learn something by assisting wherever needed. Greg soon had the valve train open and he and Rick were right in the middle of checking them out and seeing what additional cups would be needed.

Jimmy and I had attacked his BarBaks and spent much of the day proving that we could not get them to fit without modifying some of his plastics, and he just did not want to do that as he has spent a lot of time getting his RS very clean and original. He ultimately decided to stay with the original set up and sign up for a good Chiropractor.

Jonathan, meanwhile has changed his oil and exposed his valves (not a good image) only to find out that the valves were within spec. It was good to see what the insides of a waterhead looked like in any case.

Unfortunately Greg's bike had to stay over as we were short the particular valve cup he needed for the number 1 cylinder. If you have family they can also come out and volunteer during the race.



Greg Lievan sent this in.

While reading my February issue of BMW ON and came across a review discussing Aerostich's LED Mini-Lights (pg 30). As I read the review it became apparent that these lights were design more for identification than road illumination. I have believed for a long time that motorist are conditioned to see two head lights, ie: the front of a car. When they see only one headlight it doesn't register in their brain. Over time I have read several articles written by academics that validate what I have suspected for a long time. Early on in my motorcycling carer I got in the habit of mounting auxiliary lights around the front of the bike, trying to make the bike look more like a car, at least to the opposing divers mine. I have used different sizes that have used 55w halogen bulbs, which are bright but burden the electrical system. When you start to look at the auxiliary lights offed for motorcycling they are, in my view, horribly expensive. While well made, they are just were out of my budge. So, in looking for a lower cost option; I found driving lights from Wall-Mart, just as functional, but significantly less expensive. And when they go bad, they are cheap enough to just throw away and replace. About a year ago it was time to replace my existing auxiliary lights, so I stoped by Wall-Mart to pick up a new set. Looking at the choices I decided to go with a four elements LED unit. However, over time, I was not overly happy with their performance. While they worked, just not as ideally as I would have liked. So, when I ran across the review of the Aerostich LED Mini-Lights, it caught my attention. The review was very positive but, I must say, I became further intrigued when I saw the price, \$23 for a pair (they are only sold in pairs). So, on an impulse buy, I ordered a set.





The lights arrive about five days after my order was placed. I had them shipped straight USPS first class. Upon opening the package the first thing I noticed is that the lights were SMALL. They measure 1.18" x 0.8" and are available in solid white, red or flashing red. I chose the solid white. As to power, that is one of the advantages of LED, they only draw 3W. The lights are comprised of three LED elements with a lens that spreads the light over a large area, don't be fooled by their definitive size. After I installed the light and had a chance to see them in operation, they were brighter than their size would suggest. The lights come with an "L" bracket for mounting and a bolt with a lock washer to secure the light to the "L" bracket. I mounded the lights just below my headlamp on the bottom of the fearing just above the front wheel fender. Having used this same location for my previous lights the wire was already in place, as well as, the hardware to mount the "L" bracket to the fairing. I used reusable Posi-Lock connectors to complete the wiring installation. It was there that I ran into a small problem. The wires leading from the Aerostich LED Mini-Lights are a grade or two smaller than typical 12V auto/motorcycle wiring. The Posi-Lock wouldn't properly grip the wires leading from the LED Mini-Lights. I ended up soldering a pigtail to the LED Mini-Lights wiring. That worked great and the Posi-Lock connectors griped perfectly. Now having ridded with the new lights for several week I am really happy with them. While it is rather difficult to observe them, as drivers would see them, while riding. I have noticed their reflection from vehicles in front of me. They show up very nicely, which was their purpose in the first place.... TO BE SEEN. All and all, if you are looking for auxiliary lighting the Aerostich LED Mini-Lights are worth a look.
